### A Chat With The Chaplain — A Monthly Devotional Thought

#### Bethel, the House of God

On our recent trip to Israel, we got to see most of the country. We were being guided by a Bible scholar whose primary roll in the Holy Land is to lead student groups from Harding University as they study the land. Because of this, we did not focus our attention on

modern tourist sites. We spent much of our time exploring places where Biblical events occurred.

It was very exciting to be able to "walk where Jesus, and other Bible personalities walked." It was more than exciting, it was inspirational and uplifting. It solidified my understanding that the Bible was a real book about real people. I fear that there is a growing number of people who see the Bible in the same light as Grimm's Fairy Tales, or some ancient Greek myth. Therefore, it was wonderful to see the real places I had studied about in the Bible since I was just a little boy.

My favorite location was a mountain top called Bethel. It is located approximately 10 miles north of Jerusalem. Bethel was very closely associated with Abraham and his grandson, Jacob, in the Biblical narrative.

It was there that God instructed Abraham to

look in every direction. God was giving to him and his descendants the land as far as he could see. (Genesis 13:14-17).

It was also there that Jacob had a dream of a ladder reaching into heaven. In the dream God restated the same promise to Jacob that He had made to his grandfather Abraham. God was giving the land to them and their offspring forever. (Genesis 28:11-17).

Deborah, the nurse of Rebekah, is buried under a tree that also stands on this mountain.

As I stood on that mountain top, I was overwhelmed with the thought that this is a very special place to God. It may not be His house or the gate of heaven, but there is some reason He has returned to this place on numerous occasions. At the apex of this mountain top there is an altar built to worship God. We were not told that the altar was built by Abraham or Jacob, but it was in the right place.

The reality that all these Bible events really happened in this real place filled me with a great sense of awe. I could understand why this place was named Bet (House) El (of God).

It was awe-inspiring to walk where Abraham walked, and especially astounding to walk where Jesus walked, but it was overwhelming, to be on the mountaintop where the creator of Heaven and Earth has chosen to visit. When I stood in that place I was filled with the presence of God.
